Alex Elias Torrez, Ph.D. was named Pflugerville ISD's Superintendent of Schools on Sept. 30, 2013.

In 2005, Dr. Torrez was named Assistant Superintendent for Secondary Education for Clear Creek ISD, located outside of Houston, where he remained until being hired as Superintendent at Pflugerville ISD in September 2013. During his time at CCISD, he led and supported the performance of 18 secondary principals, with an emphasis on student-centered learning and continued improvement of leadership that enhances student achievement. Also while at CCISD, the district's completion rate rose from 93.9% to 98.7% and the district saw an increase in the number of high schools earning exemplary and recognized ratings from the Texas Education Agency. In 2010, CCISD was the second-largest Exemplary school district in Texas.
